

Civil War Geese Quilt

Materials

- 8 Fat Eights of dark civil war prints (9 x 22 inches or a FQ cut in half)
- 8 Fat Eights of light (read cream) civil war prints
- 1 Yard sashing fabric (or if cutting length of grain; 50 inches in length)

Cutting

Cut all of the dark civil war prints into fourteen 8 1/4 inches squares.
Cut eight 4 3/8 inch squares from each light civil war print.

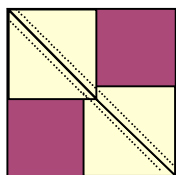
Cut eight sashing strips 25 inches by 4 inches from 1 yard of fabric.
(If cutting from length of grain; four strips 4 inches wide by 49 1/2 inches long.)

Sewing Instructions

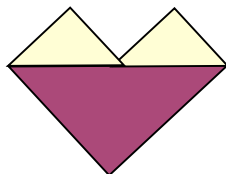
No waste flying geese

Mark a diagonal line on all of the light civil war print squares.

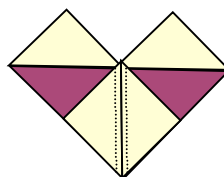
Take one dark print and 2 light print squares and place them as shown.



Sew a scant 1/4 inch from each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the drawn line. Iron the two small triangles open. You will get two units that look like a heart.

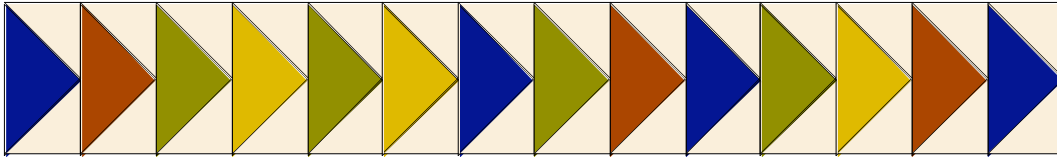


Place one small triangle on the bottom of the heart shaped unit as shown. Sew a scant 1/4 inch from each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the drawn line and iron the small triangle open. Each heart shaped unit will yield 2 geese.

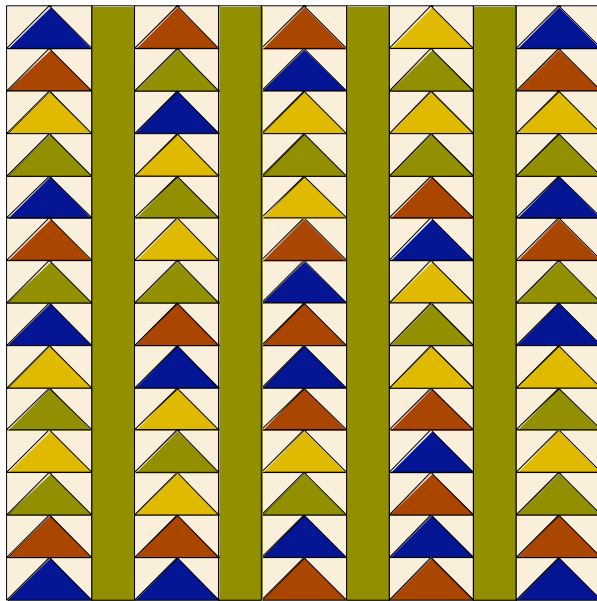


Quilt Assembly

Sew the geese into rows of 14 per row. (You will have two geese unit left over)



Sew sashing strips in pairs (end to end) to make four 49 1/2 inch by 7 1/2 inch strips. Sew the rows together with a sashing strip in between each row.



Border as desired.
